3. *Students who have credit in MATH 114 cannot get credit in ECON 289 and will need to replace it with another senior-level Economics course.

Important Planning Notes (cont'd)

Completing the correct sequence of courses is particularly important for first and second year students considering the Economics Major and Honours program. It is recommended that students declaring the Economics Major and considering the Economics Honours program complete the following courses in **year two**:

Fall 2019

ECON 281 – Intermediate Microeconomics

ECON 289 – Intro Mathematical Economics

Winter 2020

ECON 299 – Quantitative Methods in Economics

ECON 384 – Microeconomic Theory

Either Fall 2019 or Winter 2020

ECON 282 – Intermediate Macroeconomics

Completion of ECON 384 in year two is optional for students who wish to declare the Economics Major. However, if you are considering Economics Honours, it is important for students to take ECON 384 at this time as it is a prerequisite for courses taken in year three.
