Important Planning Notes

1. ECON courses can be used to satisfy the Social Sciences breadth requirement of a Bachelor of Arts degree.
2. ECON courses can be used to satisfy the Social Sciences or Arts core requirement of a Bachelor of Science degree.
3. Students are required to research and meet the prerequisites for every senior-level ECON course they take as part of their degree. STAT 151 or 161 and ECON 289 or MATH 114 are common prerequisites for senior-level ECON courses and will benefit students studying Economics. However, students may not require them depending upon the senior-level courses they choose. Students who have credit for MATH 114 are not required to take ECON 289.
4. STAT 151 or 161 and MATH 114 can be used to satisfy the Analytical Studies breadth requirement of a Bachelor of Arts degree.
5. Additional economics credits can be placed in options. Bachelor of Arts students can take up to 60 credits in any one discipline.
