

Overall Major Requirements

- 42-60 non-duplicative philosophy credits
- A maximum of 9 credits at the 100-level
- A minimum of 36 senior-level credits
- At least 6 credits at the 400-level (*PHIL 498 does not satisfy this requirement*)
