Important Planning Notes

1. PSYC courses can be used to satisfy the Sciences or Social Sciences breadth requirement of a Bachelor of Arts degree.
2. PSYC courses can be used to satisfy the Social Sciences or Arts core requirements of a Bachelor of Science degree.
3. PSYC 241 and SOCI 241 are equivalent courses. Credit can be obtained in only one of the two courses. SOCI 241 can be used towards a Psychology minor. The course can only be credited once towards a degree.
4. Additional psychology credits can be placed in options. Bachelor of Arts students can take up to 60 credits in any one discipline.
