

Overall Major Requirements

- 42-60 non-duplicative sociology credits
- A maximum of 6 junior level credits
- A minimum of 36 senior level credits
- At least 6 credits at the 400-level (*SOCI 426 does not satisfy this requirement*)
- All Sociology majors complete the same 24 credits in Specific Major Requirements, and an additional 18 to 36 credits in senior level courses which are determined by a student's specialization: General Sociology, Criminology or Family, Youth and Diversity
- Courses may be used to satisfy both the breadth and major requirements

Important Planning Notes

1. SOCI courses can be used to satisfy the Social Sciences breadth requirement of the Bachelor of Arts degree.
2. SOCI 241 and PSYC 241 are equivalent courses. Credit can be obtained in only one of the two courses. PSYC 241 can be used towards a Sociology major. The course can only be credited once towards a degree.
3. Students who have previously completed SOCI 210 will not be required to take SOCI 310, as SOCI 210 and 310 are equivalent.
4. Please keep in mind that course offerings will vary from academic year to academic year. Students may address questions about planned course offerings to the Sociology discipline chair or the Faculty of Arts and Science Program Services Office.
5. SOCI 426, which is a field placement course, does not satisfy this major's 400-level requirements. Please see an advisor in the sociology department for more information.
