Important Planning Notes

1. SOCI courses can be used to satisfy the Social Sciences breadth requirement of the Bachelor of Arts degree.
2. SOCI courses can be used to satisfy the Social Sciences or Arts core requirement of the Bachelor of Science degree.
3. SOCI 241 and PSYC 241 are equivalent courses. Credit can be obtained in only one of the two courses. PSYC 241 can be used towards a Sociology minor. The course can only be credited once towards a degree.
4. Students who have previously completed SOCI 210 will not be required to take SOCI 310, as SOCI 210 and 310 are equivalent.
5. Additional sociology credits can be placed in options. Bachelor of Arts students can take up to 60 credits in any one discipline.
6. See the reverse side of this sheet for a listing of Sociology courses offered at MacEwan University. Please keep in mind that course offerings will vary from academic year to academic year. Students may address questions about planned course offerings to the Sociology discipline chair or the Faculty of Arts and Science Program Services Office.
