II. Reports:

a. Dean's Report

- Announced and congratulated the faculty members who have successfully completed extension of probation and tenure.
- For the first time, we have more promotion applications for full professors going to UPC than for Associate Professor. The final decisions will be made in May.

- So far, 12 offers have been made and accepted. This year's hiring process is still ongoing and will end with hopefully 17 new faculty members being hired.
- Thank you to everyone who has served during these important processes.
- MacEwan is fortunate to be able to continue hiring when other universities are facing budget cuts and program closures.
- We are committed to increasing the proportion of classes taught by tenured and tenure-track faculty, and sessional-extended faculty are being hired into tenuretrack positions.
- Both students and faculty are still experiencing stress and anxiety, particularly during Reading Week. Mental health and balancing the workload and mental well-being presents a challenge and will be discussed further with Department Chairs.
- The provincial budget will impact available funds for hiring, special events, and other initiatives. Plans continue to move forward for the new science building. MacEwan has a lower percentage of international students and, therefore, is less impacted by the new restrictions.
- Once the School of Business building opens, Arts and Science will move into the vacated space in Building 5. Computer Science will move from the ground floor to the second floor, and both Sociology and the Dean's Office will move into Building 5, allowing other units to expand into the vacated space. There is still a need for more lab space, and plans are in place to create new labs on the main floor in Building 6.
- Faculty members are concerned about recent or attempted break-ins. It is not necessary to take laptops home. Saving files in the cloud will ensure they cannot be lost. There are planned updates to the security system as the new buildings are being built and a security desk has been added in Building 5. Security is also monitoring the camera feeds. If you see anything suspicious, including marks of an attempted break-in, notify security. Download the Safe@MacEwan app for real-time updates.

b. Update from the Office of Research Services

- Presented by Sandy Jung and Dana Chamot.
- For current information from the Office of Research Services, bookmark their website and sign up for the newsletter.
- Slides were provided.
- Research Assistants cannot report more than 40 hours per week and 8 hours per day. Hours cannot be submitted for Statutory Holidays. If a student has multiple employment records, the second record will be responsible for overtime rates.
- If hours are not monitored and entered correctly, there is a risk of running out of funding earlier than anticipated.
- The Research Office (ORS) can only help with funds that are administered through ORS; staying on budget is the responsibility of the researcher.
- Ensure approvals are received prior to claiming expenses. If you go on a complicated trip that combines work with pleasure, it is recommended to reach out for support prior to starting the trip.
- The importance of obtaining ethics approval for research involving human subjects was emphasized. Rebecca Mitchell, the Research Ethics Officer, is able to answer questions. Resources can be found on the website.

- Student Research Day: Students need a faculty supervisor to participate.
- Reminder to contact the ORS through the general mailbox and to treat the staff with respect.
- Contact the office if you have questions about funding. If you are a co-applicant for another university, the Dean still needs to approve and address conflicts.
- The submission deadline is always two weeks prior to the sponsor deadline.
- Project grants can also be used for SOTL.
