Item IV Presentations:

a) Dean's Report

- It is expected that the Fall term will proceed as scheduled.
- The decision on how to define face to face, hybrid and online courses
 was scheduled to be discussed at the June 17 General Faculties Council
 (GFC) meeting. The university-wide definitions will be shared out to all
 faculty once they are passed to allow faculty members time to adjust
 their course offerings accordingly.
- An electronic ratification vote to appoint three additional faculty members to the GFC was passed with 107 votes for and 11 opposed.
- Another electronic vote to decide the modality of future Faculty Council meetings resulted in an even split between faculty members preferring online and in-person meetings. Executive Committee decided to schedule two face to face meetings with the remainder being held online. Next year's meetings are scheduled as follows:

Monday, Nov. 21, 3-5 p.m. - online via Webex

Monday, Mar. 6, 3-5 p.m. - online via Webex

Thursday, Jun. 15, 1-3 p.m. - online via Webex

- 75 faculty members have confirmed attendance at the June 22 inperson convocation
- Faculty members are reminded to complete the online IT security training modules.

- The Faculty received 7 extension of probation applications and 5 applications for tenure, all of which were successful. An additional 9 applications for promotion to associate professor and 3 applications for full professor were heard. Of those applications, 11 promotions were successful. The Dean thanked volunteers for the time-consuming and thoughtful review of the dossiers submitted.
- Dr. Marielle Papin will join the Department of Anthropology,
 Economics and Political Science as a potential Canada Research Chair this Summer.
- Three faculty members were recently recognized. Dr. Kris Peace was announced as the 2022 Distinguished Teaching Award recipient. Dr. Nicolae Strungaru received the 2022 Distinguished Research Award. Dr Emily Milne was announced as one of the new Board of Governors Research Chairs.
- Dr. Jeff Davis is returning to his regular faculty role following the suspension of the Engineering Transfer program. Dr. Rob Wiznura is taking a one-year administrative leave before returning to his role in the English Department after many years of service in the Dean's Office. Thank you to both for their significant service.

c) **GFC Membership**

Motion #455

That effective for the 2023 Spring election, GFC membership will be determined through the election of nominees from the Faculty of Arts and Science's three divisions: Humanities, Natural Sciences, and Social Sciences – with membership spots divided so as to reflect as fairly as possible the number of tenure-track faculty members in each division.

Minaker/Ramsey Passed

This motion passed via online poll. With 10 elected seats and additional 3 appointed seats, its estimated 5 seats will be filled by Natural Science faculty members, and 4 faculty members from both Humanities and Social Sciences. A question was asked about how Psychology faculty members are categorized, as they can be in either the Natural Sciences or Social Sciences. Psychology faculty members are asked upon hiring which division is the best fit for them. The first Faculty Council package of the year lists all faculty according to the divisions. That the additional appointed members to GFC per GFC Bylaw article 5.1.4.4 will be added to the regular election for GFC members each Spring.

Minaker/Wiznura Passed

This motion passed via online poll. Faculty members appointed this year will be on GFC for either a one-year, two-year, or three-year term to ensure one position comes up for election on an annual basis in future years. All positions will be refilled via election once the current term expires. A concern was raised that with the rank ballot system currently in use by the faculty, a person with the least votes could still get appointed to GFC despite being the least favoured. Faculty members were reminded that

every person who ran was willing to stand for election when others were not. A question was asked about the current representation of the three divisions on GFC. These numbers were not available during the meeting; however, they will be shared during the election next year. Anyone with a concern about this process can address it with the Executive Committee.
