3. Chair's update

Reported by R. Baril, Vice-Chair, FFAC Council

Raymond Baril reported the following items:

- Dr. Deborah Saucier has resigned as President of MacEwan University as of July 3. Dr. Saucier has
 accepted a position as president of Vancouver Island University.
- Governance consultant David Marshall provided several recommendations for consideration as MacEwan University forms a General Faculties Council.
- The FFAC strategic planning process has been paused until the MacEwan strategic plan is more fullyformed.

4. General Faculties Council update

Annetta Latham provided the following report from the January 22, 2019 General Faculties Council meeting:

- Under Part 1 in the PSLA, MacEwan University will form an alumni association and a General Faculties Council.
- The Provost pro tempore reported that he intends to create 50 new full-time academic positions over the next four years.
- The Bachelor of Music baccalaureate review action plan was approved.
- To better prepare open studies students to transition into a program, there was a recommendation to
 classify students into categories, which would provide those students who plan on applying to a program
 with services to better support their education (e.g. advising).

- Terri Suntjens, Director, and Krista Hanscomb, Community Engagement Coordinator and Student Advisor, kihêw waciston, presented on the educational services offered through kihêw waciston and recommended that faculty and staff educate themselves, reach out, and build relationships.
- The committee requested that all curriculum approvals first require department council approval. The department council approval dates ensure committee members that the materials presented have been reviewed by subject-matter experts and allows them to focus on higher-level review.
- The new online syllabus system is delayed and will likely not be implemented this academic year. For now, faculty should continue working in the Google Team drive.
