## 2.0 Community Engaged Scholarship Grant - Dr. Raymond Baril

Dr. Raymond Baril, Director, Community Engaged Scholarship, gave an overview of the Community Engaged Scholarship Grants. There has been a 60% increase of external grant holders within the University. Community Engaged Grants and Scholarrships involve a community partner, a faculty member and students.

Community Engaged Scholarship Grant applications open on December 1<sup>st</sup>. An Information session to give guidance on the process will be held on February 3<sup>rd</sup> and the Application deadline is April 3<sup>rd</sup>. The grant amount available is \$5000.00.

Convocation was successful with approximately 172 HCS graduates. The Dean's medal recipients were from Hearing Aid Practitioner (diploma recipient) and the Applied Degree in Human Service Administration (degree recipient) Programs

Open House was successful and resulted in a slight spike in applications.

Indspire will be hosting its upcoming Soaring: Indigenous Youth Empowerment Gathering in Edmonton on May 9-10, 2023. Youth from the gathering are expected at MacEwan on May 9<sup>th</sup>. Chairs will be reaching out to faculty to showcase programming.

Life Kits are being assembled from the Dean's Office; donations are being collected. Assembly and distribution of the Life Kits will occur in mid-January.

Congratulations were give to Clina Vipond Research Assistant to Cynthia Puddu for receiving a USRI Dissmination award of \$1500.00 for her project wâhkôhtowin, wîkiwin and LandBack: Practical Application".

A MacEwan Strategic Award of \$20,000 for a distinctive interdisciplinary research project: "Breaking down barriers to pursuing a post-secondary education by bridging the gap between MacEwan University and children/youth in the Edmonton community" to Ozlum and colleagues from sociology (Dr. Emily Milne) and chemistry (Dr. Kaitlyn towse-Straub).

As well, Ozlum received a SSHRC Institution Grant of ~\$7000 as PI for her project entitled "Documenting young children's loose parts play with parents".

Congratulations to Fiona Edward-Akunesiobike - SSHRC Institutional Grant Award of \$7,000 to your research project: "A Scoping Review on the Knowledge Gaps in the Current Literature Critical Race Theory and Anti-Black Racism Framework in Social Work Education, Research, and Practice".
