To be considered for early admission, a complete list of all grade 11 and grade 12 subjects (completed, in-progress and planned) must be presented on your application for admission along with any additional "other" admission requirements. Applications will be evaluated based on final grades in grade 11 and/or grade 12 subjects (or equivalent).

- ¹ Diploma exit option after successful completion of the first two years of the program
- ² Post-diploma programs: These programs require completion of post-secondary coursework and/or post-secondary credentials prior to admission they are not direct entry programs. Information on admission requirements to these programs can be found by visiting MacEwan.ca/Programs.
- ³ Bachelor of Social Work requires a Social Work diploma or completion of 60 university-level credits, including 3-credits of university-level English, 6-credits of university-level coursework from anthropology, political science, psychology or sociology, and SOWK 240: Introduction to Social Work and Social Welfare (or equivalent) with a minimum grade of C-.
- ⁴ Admission is competitive where the number of qualified applicants exceeds the number of seats available. Competitive programs may have earlier deadlines, higher admission averages or additional admission criteria such as auditions or writing samples.
- ⁵ To be eligible for Public Relations: applicants must have a minimum of 30 post-secondary credits, including a post-secondary English course with a minimum grade of C+
- ⁶ Travel and Tourism is a 2-year program compressed into 13 months.



STEPS TO APPLY

- 1. Submit an application through ApplyAlberta.ca.
- You will receive a <u>myMacEwan.ca</u> email address. Please log in to the myMacEwan Portal. From this point forward, all communication must be from this address.
- Submit electronic documents through myStudentSystem within the myMacEwan Portal by August 1 for Fall intakes and December 1 for Winter intakes:
 - a. Login to <u>myMacEwan.ca</u> and click on myStudentSystem
 - b. Click on the "My Documents" tile
 - c. Choose the document type and upload all educational documents and certified translations separately:
 - ELP test results (IELTS, TOEFL, etc.)
 - High school transcripts
 - Post-secondary transcripts (university or college, if applicable)
 - Document translations
 - Passport photo page (for name verification)
- 4. Please check program specific requirements and upload any additional items as needed, such as First Aid training or police information checks. Also make arrangements for auditions. Upload all electronic documents early to allow for quicker decision times. Refer to the program website for submission instructions.
- Applications will not be evaluated until all supporting documents are received. Processing time is calculated from date all required documents are received.
- 6. Once you have received your offer through MyStudentSystem, you must accept the offer and pay the deposit, using Flywire, before the indicated deadline.
- 7. All final official documents must be submitted directly to the university by respective issuing authority by August 1 for fall intake or December 1 for winter intake All documents uploaded by an applicant may be used in consideration of an admission decision but are considered unofficial.

Unless an earlier closing date is indicated, international applicants must apply by **May 1** for Fall intake, **October 1** for Winter intake, and **January 30** for Spring/Summer intake.

International students considering Open Studies should consult with a MacEwan International recruiter prior to submitting an application.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY (ELP)

BACHELOR DEGREES, DIPLOMAS AND CERTIFICATES

IELTS - Minimum overall band score of 6.5 and a minimum score of 5.5 in each component.

TOEFL - 86 iBT (internet-based) and a minimum score of 21 on all 4 sections of Reading/Listening/Speaking/Writing.

Duolingo - Minimum score of 115.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING & BRIDGE TO CANADIAN NURSING

IELTS - Minimum overall band score of 6.5 and a minimum score of 5.5 in Reading and Writing, 6.0 in Listening and 7.0 in Speaking.

TOEFL - 86 iBT (internet-based) and a minimum score of 21 in Reading and Writing, 23 in Listening and 26 in Speaking.

BACHELOR OF PSYCHIATRIC NURSING

IELTS - Minimum overall band score of 6.5 and a minimum score of 5.5 in Reading, 5.5 in Writing, 7.0 in Speaking and 6.0 in Listening.

TOEFL - 86 iBT (internet-based) and a minimum score of 21 in Reading, 21 in Writing, 23 in Listening and 26 in Speaking.

PREPARATORY PROGRAMS

ENGLISH AS AN ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE (EAL)

Develop your English language skills in preparation for university studies. Apply directly through MacEwan.ca/EAL.

Admission requirements: minimum overall IELTS score of 4.0 (with no skill below 3.5), or Duolingo score of 55, or equivalent.

FOUNDATION PROGRAM INTERNATIONAL

This program offers a combination of EAL, high school and even some university-level courses. You will also take Foundations 101, which teaches you the important research, writing, presentation and academic skills necessary for success in a Canadian university. Apply through <u>ApplyAlberta</u>.

Admission requirements: minimum overall IELTS score of 5.5 with no skill under 4.5, or Duolingo score of 85, or equivalent.
