"The portfolio show is the first chance for the graduating students to showcase their portfolios," says Robert Andruchow, assistant professor, Department of Fine Arts.

"Within a year of graduating, 80 per cent of our students get design jobs. The two week show in the gallery allows the students to exhibit their design work to industry professionals, the wider public and high school students."
