Kija Lado ([@kijalado](#)) is a South Sudanese multidisciplinary artist and musician born and raised in Amiskwaciwâskahikan.

Blending soulful vocals and honest storytelling, her genre-bending work aims to make both herself and others feel, know and be known.

Haitian-born spoken word artist and advocate, Medgine is a person for whom the love of language and the alchemy of words is second nature. Her multilingual upbringing (French, Creole, English) not only prompted her to begin experimenting with the potential and magic of language but naturally compelled her into a deep love of poetry. Over the years, Medgine has been diagnosed with Lupus (SLE), CIDP, Polymyositis, and Raynaud's, all of which have fuelled her desire to merge her storytelling into patient advocacy, especially for those living with chronic illnesses.

Medgine currently serves as chair of the Patient and Family Advisory Committee, with the Health Quality Council of Alberta Patient Advisor, a provincial committee that promotes patient-centered care in health initiatives across the province. She has been featured on CBC, Global TV and at the Skirtsafire and the Edmonton Poetry Festival.
