

UNIVERSITY PREPARATION PROGRAM (UP)

Our UP program provides a full range of core high school equivalency courses that are prerequisites for university, college, skills-training programs, apprenticeship training or technical institutes. These courses are offered in a university environment with quality instruction and individualized attention to help ensure success. The UP program is open to domestic and international students.

Admission Requirements

Applicants whose primary language is not English must demonstrate English language proficiency with a CLB score of at least 6 in all skills, an overall IELTS score of 6.0 with no skill below 5.0, a Duolingo score of at least 95 or an equivalent standardized language assessment.

Requirements are subject to change.

Transferability

Courses offered in the University Preparation program (except MacEwan University's CMSK 011 and CMSK 015) are equivalent to Alberta Education courses and are accepted for admission purposes by post-secondary institutions within Alberta and Canada. Contact the post-secondary institution of interest to confirm accepted admission criteria.

Courses

Offerings are dependent on student enrolment and may not be offered every term.

Courses are offered in the daytime, in person, with select online or evening options.

ENGLISH AS AN ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE (EAL)

Also known as English as a Second Language (ESL)

Our EAL program is for intermediate to advanced English language learners. The intermediate levels help learners with general English skills. In the advanced levels, we teach academic reading, writing, listening, speaking, vocabulary and study skills. Students take these courses to develop their English skills to prepare for university studies, to re-enter a profession or to get a better job. The EAL program is open to domestic and international students.

Admission Requirements

Applicants are required to meet a minimum English language proficiency score to enter the EAL program, such as:

- Canadian Language Benchmark (CLB) scores of 5 in at least 2 categories (with no skill under 4).
- International English Language Testing System (IELTS) results overall score of 4.0 (with no skill below a 3.5).
- · Duolingo English Test (DET) minimum overall band score of 55.
- Language Instruction for Newcomers to Canada (LINC) reports with applicable minimum scores.

The pimâcihisowin Foundation Program is a university transition program for Indigenous students. The Cree term pimâcihisowin translates to "to create a life of independence," and the program addresses the requirements needed to be admitted into a diploma or degree program.

It is a pathway to your chosen field of study and offers additional supports to achieve your post-secondary goals through land-based learning, mentorship and writing support, access to teachings by Indigenous instructors, cultural support and access to upgrading and university-level courses.
